Treasurer's Update

We currently have a total of \$41,298.74 in our accounts. \$18,628.80 in the General Fund, \$17,202.82 in the Fireworks account and \$5,467.12 for buoys. No payment has been made yet

for the 2020 Fireworks display.

As of the publishing of this year's newsletter, we only have 111 memberships for the current year. In a typical year approximately 260 people send in their membership dues. Again, the membership dues are the primary funding mechanism for all of the projects and activities that the Pine Lake Association takes on. For example, the Easter egg hunt, the turtle races, Halloween party, etc. So, please make sure you send in your dues and remind your neighbors to do the same. The more donations given equals more that we can do for our lake community!

Prairieville Police Reminders

Just a reminder that the department is offering seasonal house checks! If any lake resident would like their property checked by an officer we'd be happy to help. Since about 40% of the residences on the lake are



seasonal it makes sense to have it checked periodically. The property check form is available online, on the Township's website and also through a form you can fill out at the Township Hall and at the Police Department. This service is not offered by many departments any more and we are proud to continue it in an effort to make our community feel more safe and secure.

While Summer is just around the corner, the winter tundra will be upon us in no time and we would like to remind all residents to please slow down on the icy snow packed roads in Prairieville Township. Last Winter we had an increase in motorists following too close for conditions and not being able to stop for hazards due to the reduced visibility and slippery road conditions. Please drive your vehicle with the headlights on even during the day. Blowing and drifting snow limits other motorist's ability to see your vehicle. Please ensure your vehicle battery is at a full charge and carry safety equipment like a blanket, water, flashlight and a L.E.D. flasher. If your vehicle becomes disabled call 911 and do not attempt to walk out in extreme/frigid conditions to seek help on foot. Stay in your vehicle and use your cell phone to call for help. If you're stuck or off the road, clear the snow or ice from the vehicle tail pipe or pipes if there are two exhaust ports. Have a safe and enjoyable Summer & Winter!

Prairieville Township Fire Department

The **Prairieville Fire Department** would like to thank the many fine folks at Pine Lake and the surrounding neighborhoods for the very generous financial support that was shown for one of our firefighters that was injured while fighting a fire in November of 2019. The firefighter is healing and is expected to have a full recovery!

2019 was one of our busiest years to date. Most of our calls for



service were for medical assistance to people in our community. We are Medical First Responders, so we go to all calls when an ambulance is dispatched into our community. On many occasions we get to the scene and make a difference by providing critical assistance before the ambulance arrives. We're also State of Michigan certified fire fighters and respond to fires, possible fires, smoke detector and carbon monoxide alarms. We also assist our neighboring communities when they are in need of help.

Ironically we do not have any photos of our real fires (we were too busy to take them) but we do have photos of our training. We train in fire suppression tactics, vehicle extrication, cold water rescue, and familiarization with current and new equipment.

We would love to have you join us as either a firefighter or Medical First Responder or both. If you're interested in joining, contact the Township Hall at (269) 623-2664 and they will get you in touch with an officer for more information/application. You can also stop by the fire station on Lindsey Rd on any Monday at 6:00 PM during our regular weekly meeting/training and get a tour of the station and equipment. Hello from Barry County Sheriff's Marine Division!

New laws were passed designed to protect Michigan Waterways from the spread of nuisance species and fish disease. Public Act 0451 of 2018, Sec. 41325, prohibits the transport and spreading of invasive species by requiring all boats being launched be free of plants and aquatic organisms. It further requires that the boat must remove drain plugs and drain all water from bilges, ballast tanks and live wells prior to leaving that lake area. Lastly it is illegal to release unused bait and fish caught in one body of water cannot released in another unconnected body of water. Violation of this law is a Civil Infraction and \$100 fine. 2020 Pine Lake Management Update

Management of EXOTIC plant/algae species on Pine Lake has been going very well. The 2020, season will mark the eighth year of management. During the past seven seasons, PLM has been able to keep Eurasian watermilfoil to minimal levels by conducting spot treatments. Initially a whole lake Sonar treatment was conducted to provide a "reset" of milfoil to a near zero level. Although we have been seeing an increase in milfoil distribution on Pine Lake over the past few years, we have attempted to identify and aggressively address this growth. In addition to milfoil, the program has also addressed the exotic macro algae Starry stonewort as well as Curly Leaf pondweed (also exotic). Naturally occurring species have not been addressed since they are needed for a healthy lake ecosystem. Many of the phone calls and emails we receive throughout the summer end up being native vegetation.

In addition to treatment of exotic vegetation, PLM also conducts comprehensive lake surveys each year (AVAS surveys). These surveys allow us to track relative densities of both exotics and native vegetation. Since 2012 (pretreatment), Pine Lake has gone from 21 recorded native plant species to 29 species. This indicates good recovery of native plants. Eurasian watermilfoil has been maintained at a low level through



the year 2018. In 2019 we did see an increase in milfoil abundance. We will evaluate milfoil levels in 2020 and make recommendations for a possible change in strategy to "reset" the milfoil for 2021. The graph above shows the trend in milfoil abundance over the past eight years.



Water quality monitoring has also been a part of the program since 2013. For the most part, Pine Lake has had good water quality. Two key parameters checked each year are phosphorus and nitrogen. These nutrients are important in regards to how the lake grows plants and algae. Lakes high in phosphorus tend to have problems with algae growth while lakes high in nitrogen tend to be productive in regards to plant growth. Pine lake has had fairly stable and low readings for nitrogen over the years. Levels have ranged between 200-300 ug/L which is what we typically see on most lakes. For the most part, phosphorus readings have been low/normal in most seasons. The exception is 2014 and 2018 where higher than normal spring readings were measured. The graph below shows the trend in spring phosphorus since2013.



For 2020, we anticipate spot treatments will be sufficient to maintain control of Eurasian watermilfoil, Starry stonewort and Curly Leaf pondweed. Pine Lake will be evaluated ~ every 3-4 weeks. IF we do se an upward trend in milfoil

abundance, it is likely that a change in strategy will be recommended for 2021. As always, if property owners observe a weed problem, please contact us so we can investigate.
