All the while, the Pine Lake Association (PLA) is making preparations to bring you as many of our traditional Pine Lake events as we have volunteers for, including the Easter Egg Drop, the 4th of July Celebration, the Turtle Races and the Float Fest! These events provide opportunities for neighbors to connect, celebrate, and strengthen the bonds that make our community so special.

I am also working on an improved solution for buoy lights at night. Our water quality remains very high, very clean and we have kept invasive species to a minimum. However, we also face challenges such as increased boat traffic, common disregard for boating regulations and erosion issues. We will continue to work with the DNR, PLM and Barry County Marine Patrol to preserve and protect our lake, its precious natural resources and our wonderful community.

In looking ahead, the PLA is excited to welcome new residents to our beautiful Pine Lake and encourage everyone to join and support the PLA so we can

continue our Pine Lake traditions and do what we do each year to make this a great lake community! Wishing you a happy, healthy, and prosperous year ahead.

Pine Lake Management Update 2024-2025

Management has been going well on Pine Lake. Since the beginning of the program, the primary focus has been on controlloing exotic, invasive plant species. Currently there are three on Pine Lake. These are Eurasian watermilfoil, curly leaf pondweed and starry stonewort. Management has consisted of cycles of whole lake treatments followed by periods of spot, maintenance treatments.

A whole lake treatment was conducted in 2021 and we have been in a spot treatment period since then. We did see a small increase in 2024 which was likely due to the mild winter weather. We anticipate another year of spot treatments in 2025. You will be receiving a calendar in the mail showing these dates.

Water quality has also been a part of the management program each year. In 2024 things looked very good in the spring in terms of phosphorus in the lake. We did see a higher amount of phosphorus in the late summer. This is to be expected since the sample is collected 25 feet below the surface. Natural lake processes tend to cause higher values at this depth and it is not necessarily a representation of the majority of the lake volume.

For 2025 we will monitor Pine Lake every 3-4 weeks and address problems as they are found. Hopefully a more typical winter with prolonged ice cover will help reduce some early season growth of invasive species.

Lake Safety

When on the lake always remember that you are sharing it with other boaters, fishermen, swimmers and others. Make your decisions based on everyone's safety. Listed below are a few laws when operating a boat or PWC. A more comprehensive list can be found at

www.barrycounty.org/marinedivision.

- Travel counter clockwise on the lake.
- The driver of the boat or PWC cannot be intoxicated.
- Boats must have proper lighting from sunset to sunrise.
- A Boater Safety Certificate is needed for students under 12 to drive a boat, at least 14 to operate a PWC with parent and 16 without a parent. Contact Barry County Marine division about upcoming trainings.

Safety at Pine Lake

The Prairieville Township Fire Department (PTFD) and the Prairieville Township Police Department (PTPD) are both crucial to our ongoing safety. Listed in this article are some of the many ways they are working together to guarantee our well being.

- Chief Mike Reizin, Officer Paul Green and Officer Brandon Robinson make up the PTPD. Scheduling is done so someone is available every day. This year a new police vehicle was purchased to improve street patrolling.
- Chief Brian Uridge leads the PTFD. The majority of their calls are medical in nature. Today they have more EMT (Emergency Medical Technicians) trained staff than ever before in their history. There are 4 EMTs and one Paramedic. Having these personnel allows more effective emergency medical care for our community.
- The Fire and Police Departments work closely together through training and responding to calls. This allows time to understand priorities and needs of each other. The knowledge provides faster and more efficient response to the community.
- The two groups make better use of community funding by sharing resources such as reflective jackets, radios and other emergency gear.
- Both the PTPD and PTFD work with Delton and Plainwell to coordinate for our local schools. Prairieville Township and Barry Township have mutual aid agreements to back each other up. There is a strong working relationship with Plainwell Public Safety also.
