Water Safety

In the newsletter each year, we have an article about safety on the lake. This is more important than ever as we have more people on the lake. Some may have limited experience driving a boat. A friendly reminder might be all the help any of us need. Here are a few of the basic laws. You can find a more comprehensive list at the PLA website or Barry County Marine Division.

- Travel counter clockwise on the lake.
- The driver of a boat cannot be under the influence of liquor or drugs.
- Boats must have proper lighting from sunset to sunrise.
- A Boater Safety Certificate is needed for students under 12 to drive a boat, at least 14 to operate a PWC with a parent and 16 without a parent.

If a dangerous concern doesn't stop, you can call Barry County Dispatch at 911 and inform them. Getting pictures and/or a video including the boat identification number will help in the process. Thank you for making this a safe summer on the lake!
