PRAIRIEVILLE TOWNSHIP NEWS

Now under consideration by the Board is ordinance regulating the free standing wood burning type of "outdoor" furnaces. The initial wording, presented at the May 12, 2010 Township Board meeting, was to ban these types of furnaces in any area designated R-2, which is all around the lakes. There are strong opinions pro and con regarding these alternative heating sources. Let your township officials know what you think before the ordinance becomes enacted.

Long time Trustee, Bill Miller has resigned. Bill had been the liaison for Pine Lake with the County Drain Commissioner. Jim Stoneburner accepted responsibility to keep in contact with the Drain Commission as Bill had done. Hopefully, Pine Lake residents will not be surprised with another special assessment due to neglect of the Pine Lake pump in the future.

There are now only two remaining elected officials who would be affected by the recall: Supervisor Jim Stoneburner and Clerk, Jill Owen. The two new trustees who were appointed to fill vacancies left by Sharon Ritchie and Bill Miller are Jim Grundy and Rod Goebel.

Recycling bins are available the 1st and 3rd weekend of each month at the township hall. A complete schedule of dates was recently mailed to residents, along with the dates of the regular Township Board meetings.

BARRY COUNTY MARINE DIVISION SAFETY PRESENTATION

On Saturday May 15, Captain Johnson and Sergeant Jones of the Barry County Sherriff Department made an excellent presentation to a disappointingly small group of Pine Lake residents. Here are some of the highlights of the information presented:

If you are witnessing a dangerous situation, for example, an obviously intoxicated person operating watercraft, PWC operating dangerously or other incident that needs the Marine Patrol to respond: Call the **non-emergency 911** number @ **1-269-948-4800** Press **1** for Dispatch. Make note of this number. This will get the closest responder available to your situation, rather than just the Barry County Marine division which may be over an hour away.

For Emergencies use 911

Missing child: Most people do not want to check the shore because they are afraid they will actually find the child in the water. CHECK THE WATER FIRST! And don't hesitate to call **911 as soon as the child goes missing.** Captain Johnson recounted that in his personal experience, one child had been under water in cold temperatures for upwards of 45 minutes and recovered with no brain damage. Time is of the essence! Call as soon as possible - it takes time to assemble and dispatch a dive team.

If you call 911 - LEAVE THE LINE OPEN Head of the Marine Division for Barry County lake patrols is Sgt. Julie Jones @ ijones@barrycounty.org

Answers to some of the residents' questions: How long can a dock extend into the lake? The DNR has final say over this matter, however there is no legal "length" set for docks. Keep in mind that Riparian rights extend to the middle of the lake so your "area" narrows to a point at the center of the body of water. You may not infringe on your neighbors' rights. The Pine Lake Association has no legal or other jurisdiction regarding property rights or use.

Can I drink alcohol while driving my watercraft? Yes. However, the driver may not be driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Regardless of the legal limit for "impaired" or "intoxicated", keep in mind the most, perhaps 95% of tragedies on the water involved drinking while operating a motor craft. *Can I use my Docking Lights anytime?* Keep in mind that Docking Lights blind other boaters. Please use them for docking or limited use such as navigating a part of a shallow channel or other hazardous situation.

When you say Life Jackets must be "accessible", what does that mean? In a sinking or crash situation, ideally the life jackets would be throw clear of the vessel and could be used in the water. Having life jackets in plastic, under the seat, sealed shut is NOT accessible.

How long has a "throw-able floating device" been required on board? Decades! This can be as simple as a floating seat cushion that could be thrown to someone in the water. A ring or cushion that is on a line makes it easier to get that device to the person in the water and allows a "2nd try" if the cushion or ring doesn't get to the person when thrown.

How can I brush up on my knowledge of boating laws and responsibilities? Go to <u>www.boaterexam.com</u>. It's free and great for all ages. If you need to take the accompanying exam for a boater certificate it will cost \$30 and you will have to present proof of passing to Sgt. Jones in Hasting. Or take the Boater Safety course at no charge:

Boater Safety Class – Held annually on the last Saturday of June, at Shady Shores Resort on Gun Lake. The resort is located on Patterson Road 1.3 miles south of M-179, and across the street from Premiere Motors.

The class begins at 9:00 am and runs until approximately 3:00 pm, with an hour given for lunch. No pre-registration is required; however you should bring a sack lunch and a pencil. A test will be given at the end of class.
