Thank you to the many people it takes to run our volunteer department. The fire fighters and medical first responders, the township officials, and the folks in our community that pitch in every year to help make special memories for our kids. In 2021, Prairieville had 280 calls for service, just slightly higher than our 2020 volume. Over 90% of the calls in 2021 were for medical rescues vs. other types of calls, which is typical. Because medical rescues are such a high percentage of our calls, it's important that we have enough volunteers who are trained and prepared to deal with these runs. Congratulations to recently certified medical first responders: Chris Beltran; Tanner Callahan; Cassie Flick; and Devin Stuart!

We said a fond farewell to 34 year fire volunteer, great friend and a pillar of the community, Chief Bob Pence. He passed away on June 9th after having the station renamed in his honor, on June 7th.

The Prairieville Township Police Department (PTPD) proudly serves its citizens. In 2021, Officer Elijah Arnold became a member of our department. The PTPD responds to calls for service for a variety of issues. As your police department we are on patrol. Sometimes we have found a need while patrolling and other times we are reacting to a call. Never think your concern is too small to contact us. We are here for you.

Police were dispatched to the channel on Pine Lake between Lake 1 and Lake 2 just off Boniface Point on February 28, 2022. A UTV had gone through the ice. No one was hurt and the UTV was removed from the lake the next day. It was a good reminder that water safety is a year round concern.

Weed Management Andy Tomaszewski, PLM Lake & Land Management Corp.

As many of you are aware the Weed Management on Pine Lake was started in 2012 when Eurasian Watermilfoil (EWM) was in abundance. It was very effective for over 6 years. During that time after the initial treatment, a new exotic species called Starry Stonewort was found at Pine Lake. Efforts were made to address that species as well. In 2019 and 2020 we started to see an increase in EWM on the lake. In 2021 there was the second lake wide Sonar Treatment for Eurasian watermilfoil (EWM). For 2022, we expect to start the season in good shape. EWM should be minimal in 2022 and if found, can be easily addressed with spot treatments. Most of the work should involve treatment of Starry Stonewort which typically starts growing mid to late June. In addition, we will continue with water quality sampling and vegetation surveys.

> DID YOU KNOW?



Invasive Species continue to multiply in our waterways. There is no new species identified in Pine Lake and we want to keep it that way. If you are fishing or boating in other waterways, please use caution to keep from carrying these home.

ROADWORK AHEAD

Updates are coming to two of our local roads this spring. Merlau Avenue and Southgate Drive will be repaved. We thank all of you for your patience during the construction. One final reminder as some roads get smoother and are easier to travel - the speed limit is 25 mph!

Water Level Update

As of April 14, 2022 Pine Lake is at 893.3 feet. At this time last year, the lake was about 12 inches lower. We are starting the process for a permit from EGLE to pump to the gravel pit. The first step was to get authorization from the owner of the gravel pit to apply. We have already received a reply to our first request to EGLE asking for additional information. This will be submitted the week of April 18. There are no final numbers on the cost of the project, and we have no control over the timeline. It is possible that we could get a permit in 90 days, or it could be stalled for many months.

Water Safety

Safety must come first when using the water. The Marine Division cannot be here all of the time. Everyone, residents and visitors, need to be apprised of what the marine laws are prior to operating any watercraft. For everyone to enjoy the lake, it is imperative to abide by the laws at all times. Did you know it is illegal and unsafe to pull floatables with riders through the channels? You will see on the map that boating on the lake goes counterclockwise around all of the lakes. The map also shows other legal boating directions. Show respect for others by following safety laws on the water.



IMPORTANT Buoy Information

Just a heads up for anyone with buoys in the lake. The DNR has indicated it may be out enforcing this law http://legislature.mi.gov/doc.aspx?mcl-324-80159. The first line says it all. "A person shall not place a beacon or buoy, other than a mooring buoy, in the waters of this state except as authorized by a permit issued by the department pursuant to part 13." If you do not have a permit for a buoy, you will be fined.
